# ONLINE POSTER MAKING CONTEST

## RULES AND GUIDELINES

Eligibility: Contest is open to anyone who is gifted with arts around the world. No age restriction.

Registration: Register by downloading the form from [scalabrinian.org/poster](http://scalabrinian.org/poster)

Mechanics:

1. Posters must illustrate, interpret, and emphasize the Scalabrinian Year and Canonization theme **“St. Scalabrini Father of the Migrants”**
2. Each participant should submit ONE entry only.
3. Contestants are free to use any Art tools like traditional paint brush, oil pastel, etc. or computer software like photoshop, affinity, paint or any related mediums for digital artwork.
4. The poster must contain at least one image of Bishop John Baptist Scalabrini. Distinguished brand names and/or logo of any organization outside Scalabrinian Congregation are not allowed to appear as an element in your poster entries.
5. No downloaded images and clip arts can be integrated in the artwork since it should be all original.
6. Participants should also submit an **Artist Explanation** about the poster – this is an explanation in not more than 300 words describing what inspired the artwork written below the registration form.
7. Participants submit a photo of themself making the artwork they submitted. **JDC\_120190photo.jpg**
8. Make sure your image is around 300 dpi, A3 (297 x 420 mm landscape or portrait orientation).
9. Save the image in JPEG with the following information:

11. The Panel of Judges are the members of the Provincial Council of SFCP.

12. Winners agree to disclose publication of their names and other particulars as SFCP Communication Office may deemed appropriate and to participate in any photo publicity, or other media arrangements made by SFCP Communication Office to announce the winners to the general public.
13. Winners agree to modify their winning entries as requested by the SFCP Communication Office limited only to incorporating the logos of Conveners/Sponsors/ and Texts related to the event.
14. The winning material will be used for the summit backdrop, brochures for vocation promotion, magazines and other canonization ads and collateral materials.

<b>CREATIVITY/ HARMONY / DESIGN</b> <i>The poster must captivate the judges' senses.</i>	30%

## OVERVIEW OF SCALABRINIAN YEAR & CANONIZATION



### “SCALABRINI FATHER OF THE MIGRANTS”

November 9, 2022 will mark the 25th anniversary of the beatification of John Baptist Scalabrini. We still remember with joy the day when the Church recognized him as an exemplary witness of Christian life. We remember the words with which John Paul II honored him: “Deeply in love with God and extraordinarily devoted to the Eucharist, he was able to transfer the contemplation of God and his mystery into an intense apostolic and missionary endeavor, making himself all things to all people in order to proclaim the Gospel. This ardent passion of his for the Kingdom of God made him zealous in catechesis, pastoral activities and charitable work, especially towards those most in need.”

It is with great joy that we share with you the news that the Holy Father, accepting the opinion of the cardinals gathered in assembly on May 17, has decreed that Blessed John Baptist Scalabrini will be venerated as a saint in the Church. The canonization ceremony will take place on a date to be established by the consistory to be convened by Pope Francis. We know how much migrants, refugees, seafarers and all people involved in human mobility are dear to the Holy Father's heart. Many times he has pointed out to the Church and society the duty to welcome them, protect them, promote their living conditions and value their contribution to common coexistence. In proclaiming John Baptist Scalabrini a saint, Pope Francis wants to indicate to the Church the model of a bishop who not only gave himself completely to the good of his people, but also extended his heart to the sisters and brothers whom life had taken far from home.

As we thank the Holy Father for this gift and rejoice that our Founder is recognized as a model to be imitated, we feel even more empowered to keep alive the charism he passed on to us and to dedicate ourselves to the service of fraternity, where people are not driven out of their country by violence and war, are not discarded because they are redundant to the system, but are appreciated and valued in their uniqueness and diversity. Each community is invited to communicate to migrants that in Scalabrini they have a father and a patron to whom they can turn in difficulties so that he may plead the protection of God who turns his gaze of predilection on the little ones and the marginalized.

Together with the communities, let us first prepare our spirit for the great canonization event, in order to be worthy of the grace the Lord has given us and to be docile instruments towards the communion of those who are scattered.

Let us embrace this opportunity to live a “Scalabrinian year” that will begin on Sunday, November 7, 2021, and will end on Wednesday, November 9, 2022. The theme for the Scalabrinian year is: Making the world everyone’s homeland, a theme that fits in with the recent teaching of Pope Francis. May the Holy Spirit, who guided Blessed Scalabrini along the many paths explored by his immensely charitable heart, guide us so that we may grow tirelessly in charity.
